The Precepts of the Catholic Faith
Part Four of Seven Part Series

Jesus Christ: Yesterday, Today, and Forever ~

This week we continue our series on the Precepts of the Catholic Church: “pre” meaning “before”, and “cept” meaning “life” – before there can be full life in God, these seven laws must be observed. Failure to live them out would constitute a mortal sin: when one has knowledge of them, and acts without undue coercion to disregard them. “The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary *minimum* in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor”. *Catechism #2041*. This week we continue working our way through them by exploring the fourth precept. They are listed here again as a reminder.

The Precepts of the Catholic Church

1. To attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and rest from servile works.
2. To observe the days of abstinence and fasting.
3. To confess our sins to a priest at least once a year. Traditionally, during the seasons of Lent or Easter.
4. To receive Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist at least once a year: preferably during Lent or the Easter Seasons.
5. To contribute to the support of the Church [Stewardship of time, talent, and treasure (tithe)].
6. To obey the laws of the Church concerning Matrimony [Catholics who marry are obligated to wed in the Catholic Church].
7. To participate in the Church's mission of Evangelization of Souls.

Remember the first precept, that we are obligated to attend Mass on all the Holy Days of Obligation and Sunday is always a Holy Day of Obligation. However, we are not obligated to receive the Holy Eucharist (Communion) at each of those Masses, to do that we need to be properly disposed. Only those who are Catholic, have been prepared for and received their 1st Holy Communion, and are not aware of any unconfessed mortal sin, are able to receive Holy Communion worthily. If these three conditions are not met, then a sacrilege has occurred. God says to us through St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 11:27-30 *“This means that whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily sins against the body and blood of the Lord. A man should examine himself first; only then should he eat of the bread and drink of the cup. He who eats and drinks without recognizing the body, eats and drinks a judgment on himself. That is why many among you are sick and infirm, and why so many are dying.”* It is a mortal sin to receive Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin. The last thing we want to do is commit a mortal sin at Mass!

As evident by the percentage of people who receive Holy Communion at Mass, most Catholics in the U.S. assume that they are supposed to receive Holy Communion if they attend Mass, this is profoundly wrong. This wasn't always the case. Throughout the Church's 2000 year history, it has only been in about the last 55 years, in this country and a few others, that Catholics have lost the knowledge about who is supposed to receive Holy Communion and who isn't.

If you attend Mass in Latin America, you'll notice a significant percentage of Mass goers not receiving Holy Communion. While only a minority of Catholics in those countries still go to Mass, those who do, know when they should and shouldn't receive Holy Communion. A significant problem today, at least in America, is getting Catholics who shouldn't receive Holy Communion, to not receive Holy Communion. Until the 1960's in this country and around the world, the problem was the reverse: getting Catholics to want to receive Holy Communion enough to go to Confession, and be restored to a state of grace to do so. For the vast majority of the Church's history, most Catholics were content to receive Holy Communion only a handful of times in life, so the Church mandated the receiving of Holy Communion to at least once a year. We live in different times indeed.

We are obligated to put into practice precepts three and four at least once a year during the season of Lent or the season of Easter, both of which are about seven weeks long. We do this by going to Confession and while still in a state of grace, receiving Holy Communion at Mass.
