Attributes of God

- 1. Eternal: no beginning and no ending
- 2. Infinite: in knowledge, power, and love

God is a Holy Trinity

There is one God in three divine persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Jesus Christ

Is God, with no beginning or ending, co-eternal with the Father and Holy Spirit, the Word of God who took flesh and revealed that He is God's Son, the sole Redeemer of the human race.

Why God Created Us

To know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him, so we can be happy with Him in heaven.

Why Jesus Christ Established the Catholic Church [the Mission of the Church]

- 1. For the greater glory of God
